Social work is a profession that seeks to improve the functioning and life satisfaction of people across the life span. They work with individuals and groups but also focus on improving the communities and the larger environments in which people work and function. They improve the lives of people primarily through individual and social advocacy.

The Loras Social Work program emphasizes both classroom learning and experiential learning. In the classroom professors use active learning processes to teach essential theories, principles and skills. Practicum placements then provide opportunities for student to apply those principles and practices. The experiences students have in Practicum also importantly assist students in designing career goals that fit who they are as a person. Practicum sites are available in a wide variety of agencies and organizations such as residential treatment centers for children and adolescents, nursing homes, probation departments, domestic violence and foster care agencies, and others.

The Social Work discipline is recognized by many employers as an exciting, multifaceted discipline which offers a valuable knowledge base and skill level in a wide variety of settings. When Social Work majors complete their undergraduate education, they can be employed as a school counselor, a probation officer, child abuse investigator, domestic violence advocate, hospital worker, elder in-home worker and others.
